Campus Based Leadership Teams (CBLT)

A campus-based leadership team consists of a group of school leaders at the campus level who possess knowledge of literacy development and who have experience with age-appropriate literacy instruction for children Age 0 to school entry, Kinder to 5th grade and Grade 6 to 12. Leadership teams include all those who impact literacy achievement for students.

At each campus, leadership teams were created and may include principals, administrators, teacher specialists, teachers, special education teachers, parents, and those who impact literacy achievement for all age students.

The leadership team is responsible for facilitating the creation of a sustainable data-informed instructional plan based on the five components of reading, multiple sources of student and teacher data, best practices, English Language Arts and Reading, Spanish Language Arts and Reading, English Language Proficiency Standards, Texas Essential Knowledge and Skills, and district guidelines.

Participants CONSUME then select a poem to perform or dramatize.




This workstation focused on CRITIQUING by incorporating the elements of poetry.
